The scope of the teaching obligation is based on §3 of the Lehrverpflichtungsverordnung NRW.

We offer a challenging position with the possibility of pursuing a PhD. A strong affinity for quantitative research methods is recommended, but not mandatory. Good knowledge of microeconomics and willingness to support research projects relevant to energy and climate policy are expected.

Requirements: An above-average degree in economics, business mathematics or a comparable qualification. In-depth knowledge of microeconomics and the willingness to familiarize oneself with modern methods, especially of empirical economic research, are expected.
